





Coordination Nationale des Organisations Paysannes du Mali (CNOP) is leading his pilot initiative in collaboration with Helvetas-Swiss Intercooperation.

Despite more than two decades of decentralization attempts, natural resource and land governance in Mali remain highly centralized. Overlapping statutory and customary land rights result in frequent conflict, which are further exacerbated by the increasing prevalence of large-scale land acquisitions for commercial developments.



The recent Peace Accords (2015) offer a critical opportunity to address weak land governance and to alleviate the threat it poses to national security and the wellbeing of local communities. The Tenure Facility is supporting CNOP and Helvetas-Swiss Intercooperation to accelerate the implementation of a new land policy for the decentralized management of natural resources, and to strengthen village and community land rights.
