

La Federación Nativa del Río Madre de Dios y Afluentes (FENAMAD), an affiliate of AIDESEP, is leading this pilot initiative in collaboration with Sociedad Peruana de Derecho Ambiental (SPDA).

The region of Madre de Dios in Peru is characterized by overlapping land rights and conflicts over indigenous territories. Indigenous communities are at a disadvantage when they attempt to defend themselves against the multiple threats they face, from illegal mining and logging to land speculation and invasion. Over 50 percent of indigenous communities in the region have

incomplete, inaccurate titles or have not yet begun the titling process. The Tenure Facility is supporting FENAMAD to work with regional governments and SPDA to secure indigenous lands and enhance communities' ability to manage their natural resources. In addition to this, this initiative is generating and channeling legislative and regulatory proposals to support the legal security of Indigenous Peoples and their collective rights, including the rights of Indigenous Peoples in voluntary isolation.
